1. Overview

The Open Group® Certification for People: Open FAIR™ Certification Program (the Program) makes certification available to people who demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the Body of Knowledge covered by the Program. The Program also provides accreditation for training courses designed to help people acquire the necessary knowledge and understanding of the Body of Knowledge in order for the person to achieve certification.

The Program is based upon a set of key documents:

1. *The Open Group Certification for People: Certification Policy*, which sets out the policies and processes by which an individual may achieve certification.
2. *The Open Group Certification for People: Open FAIR™ Conformance Requirements*, which documents what elements of the Body of Knowledge an individual must know, understand, or be able to do, including depth of knowledge required, in order to achieve a given level of certification.
3. *The Open Group Certification for People: Training Course Accreditation Policy*, which sets out the policies and processes by which a training course may achieve accreditation.
4. *The Open Group Certification for People: Training Course Accreditation Requirements*, which documents the criteria that must be met by a training course in order to achieve accreditation.

These four documents together set out the policies, processes, and requirements for the Program.

This document defines the values for the terms used within the key documents.

2. Program Configuration

Capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to them in either The Open Group Certification for People Certification Policy or Training Course Accreditation Policy.

<p>The purpose of certification for Open FAIR™ Foundation is to provide validation that an individual has gained knowledge of the fundamentals of the Open FAIR Body of Knowledge, including knowledge of the terminology, structure, and basic concepts of the Open FAIR Body of Knowledge, and understands the core principles of risk analysis using Open FAIR, the Risk Analysis Standard, and the Risk Taxonomy Standard sufficient to be able to contribute to a risk analysis project.</p> <p>The learning objectives at this level focus on knowledge and comprehension.</p>	<p>The target audience for this level includes, but is not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Individuals who require a basic understanding of Open FAIR, the Risk Analysis Standard, and the Risk Taxonomy Standard• Professionals who are working in roles associated with a risk analysis project, such as those responsible for planning, execution, development, delivery, and operation• Risk analysts who are looking for a first introduction to Open FAIR, the Risk Analysis Standard, and the Risk Taxonomy Standard• Risk analysts who want to achieve Open FAIR Certified (Advanced) certification (when offered) in a stepwise approach

2.6 Migration

The Open Group Open FAIR Certification Program is a successor to FAIR certifications previously carried out by CXOWARE and Risk Management Insights.

The Program is available to new certification candidates as well as to people already certified as FAIR Basic Risk Analysts by CXOWARE and Risk Management Insights.

3. Extended Accreditation Requirements

In addition to the requirements in The Open Group Certification for People: Training Course Accreditation Requirements document, the following requirement shall apply for the Program:

Before delivering any Accredited Training Courses, including any training courses taught as part of a trainer induction program, a trainer must have passed a trainer examination provided by The Open Group.
